Each day we live out our lives. Our stories. Just as those who came before us. Our role models. Our examples. Our heros of the faith.



# 100 YEARS OF TRINITY

Did you know that one of Trinity's core values is hospitality? Our mission is to connect people with God, others, and God's work in the world. At Trinity, intentional hospitality plays a key role in our desire to connect people with others.

On Sundays, whether it's from a greeter, usher, coffee server, or someone else in the building, we hope every visitor receives a warm and genuine greeting and knows that Trinity is a place where they are welcome, and a place where they can belong.

A key aspect of hospitality at Trinity includes the coffee ministry. This Sunday morning coffee fellowship began in 1971 in the basement of the old building. Over the years it moved to the narthex, then to the north lawn in the summers, and even to the south side of the building during construction. There have been several other activities and events over the years that have encouraged fellowship and connection within Trinity.
