100 YEARS OF TRINITY

Did you know that, on average, 40 individuals volunteer their time and skills each Sunday morning during the summer months? Some of those volunteers are greeters and ushers, coffee servers, nursery providers, worship and tech volunteers, adult education facilitators, and deacons.

During the school year, when there are three services and kids/ youth Sunday School, that number jumps to an average of 70 volunteers each Sunday morning. An additional 60 volunteers help with Wednesday night activities throughout the year, including Lighthouse Kids and Youth Group.

Many individuals, including elders and deacons, participate in and lead various ministry and service teams at Trinity. Volunteers lead adult programming throughout the week. Others serve as Life Group leaders or help in preparing and serving Wednesday night meals. Others volunteer their time with special cleaning projects or setting up for programming and events. And most of the outdoor yard work is completed by volunteers.
