ONE CHURCH, TWO LOCATIONS

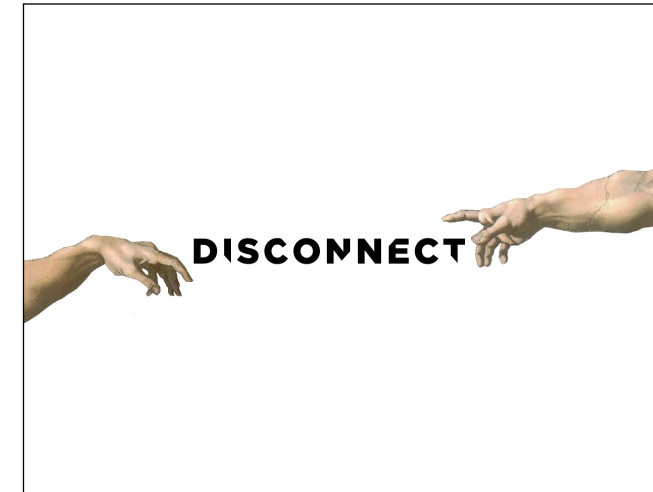
