Uncharted: The Messiah is on the Loose

Today, **Pastor Ben Vos** will explore with us the last eight verses of Mark's gospel, where we see that the women who head to the tomb are in for a surprise. Just like so many other characters in the book of Mark, these women have certain expectations for Jesus. They assumed that the tomb would be sealed, the body of Jesus would still be inside, and that their role was to finish the burial process. When they arrive, none of that is true. The stone is rolled away, Jesus is not there, and the spices they bought to embalm His body are now useless. Again, Jesus has escaped any sort of expectation or assumption that people put on Him. He's a loose cannon Messiah, and not even death and the grave could hold Him. As we celebrate His resurrection on Easter Sunday, we are invited to step into this story and participate with our wild King in bringing His kingdom. Leave your assumptions and expectations and constrains at the door. Jesus is on the loose and He's calling us to join Him!
