AFRICA

Titus & Mary Baraka –Uganda (Words of Hope)

Titus works with Words of Hope to bring the gospel message to the country of Uganda. One of the primary ministries is the broadcast of Christian messages and the distribution of self-powered radios. Titus also works with education at a primary school in the region and holds many pastoral training opportunities and evangelistic endeavors. Trinity manages the sponsorship program for the school which includes 78 student sponsorships.

Chad & Dara Vanden Bosch – Mozambique (RCA)

Chad and Dara serve in partnership with Audio Scripture Ministries, distributing audio Bibles and also providing palliative care. At the heart of everything they do is sharing the gospel in the language of people's hearts. Through their work with New Harvest Farm, they teach resilient farming practices so farmers can better provide for their families.

Rowland & Jane Van Es –Kenya (RCA)

St. Paul's University in Limuru, Kenya, prepares men and women for ministry in the Christian church and in society. Founded as a divinity school, it recently expanded to become a Christian university that offers a business degree in addition to theological studies. Rowland, trained in economics and theology, teaches in both departments while Jane teaches sociology and psychology while assisting with the master's-level program in pastoral care and HIV/AIDS. Rowland and Jane served previously in Sierra Leone, Malawi, and the Gambia. They have two daughters, Jenna and Michelle.

Tara Woodward –South Africa (RCA/CRC)

Tara serves as a Missional Networker in South Africa, building bridges and matching churches between the African and North American continents. She facilitates and strengthens existing partnerships and theological networks in the Gauteng province, and also forges new partnerships, emphasizing creative initiatives like-but not limited to-preaching collaboratives, field education experiences, contextualized community development projects, and opportunities for young adults. Recognizing the significant emigration of South African young adults to other continents due to unemployment and political instability, Tara is also developing diverse diaspora networks that focus on mentorship, job skills, and practice-based urban workplace theologies, contributing to the vibrant and diverse ministry context of South Africa.

ASIA

Nathan & Nozomi Brownell –Japan (RCA)

The Brownells live in Yokohama, Japan, and are serving youth and children in the area in partnership with Nihon Kirisuto Kyodan. Nathan teaches at an RCA-founded school, Nozomi recruits and trains volunteers for Children and Worship, and they both work at the Green House. In a culture where adolescence can bring unbearable stress, their ministry is critical in creating Christ-centered environments of acceptance, forgiveness, and hope.

Kist-Okazaki, Abraham & Sayuri –Japan (RCA)

Abraham and Sayuri Kist-Okazaki are ordained RCA pastors who work together in evangelistic training for congregations of the United Church of Christ in Japan. They teach churches how to incorporate contemporary music and "seeker-friendly" elements into their worship services so they can more effectively reach non-Christians, who make up 99 percent of Japan's population. Sayuri, who

was born in Tokyo, and Abraham, who was born in Milwaukee, met in 1987 in a summer Greek class at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan. They have two children: a son, Akio, & a daughter, Haruka.

EUROPE

Felipe & Janelle De Waard-Silva – *Romania (RCA)*

Felipe and Janelle work with Roma youth and focus on gospel-centered community development models and ministries. They began with the Fara Limite Climbing Gym to reach out to local youth and families and help them develop character, respect, employable skills, and a heart for Christ. Anchor Church grew out of these relationships and now serves as the foundation for the youth, discipleship, and adult ministries.

Dave & Jody Nonnemacher – *Romania (New Horizons foundation)*

Dave works with this ministry that focuses on gospel-centered community development models and ministries. One of the key tools is the IMPACT clubs that have been started in numerous places. He's also developed a partnership with New Vision Renewable Energy that works with marginalized communities in the Appalachian region. By people and organizations, solar lights were built and delivered to the people of Ukraine.

Pav & Meg Vasileiadou – *Greece (Commission to Every Nation)*

Meg and Pav's life mission is *Growing in the knowledge of God's Living Word, while helping others do the same*. Since 2011, they have worked towards this goal by serving the Greek Bible College, planting a church in downtown Athens, and spending living on the Greek island of Lesbos—a location deeply impacted by waves of refugee populations. Their work currently includes localizing (translating and contextualizing) and promoting video libraries of Bible study resources from English into Greek, meeting technical and software development needs, and inviting others to join in studying scripture.

Tyler & Audrey Wiese – *Slovenia (Assemblies of God World Missions)*

Tyler and Audrey live in Ptuj, Slovenia where they are partnering with the national Pentecostal church to support and disciple young believers to share their faith with confidence and reach marginalized people groups through the context of loving relationship. They help lead a conversational English club focused on reaching unchurched children by providing fun and interactive gospel-centered activities. They are engaged in friendship evangelism and outreach efforts with the Romani people in their region and are helping launch a Royal Rangers outpost—a ministry that teaches children outdoor and survival skills while teaching them about God's love for them.

LATIN AMERICA

Phil & Olivia Iekel – *Nicaragua (RCA--Engineering Ministries International)*

Phil serves as the Office Director for Engineering Ministries International (EMI) in Managua, and along with Olivia, leads the office to grow EMI's vision for ministry. They embrace the values of design, discipleship, and diversity as they offer professional design expertise to communities, churches, and

Christian ministries across Latin America for development and building projects where resources are otherwise limited. EMI desires to see people restored by God and the world restored through design.

Nicole Opgenorth – Nicaragua (RCA--CEPAD)

Nicole works with the Reformed Church in America partner ministry CEPAD (Council of Evangelical Protestant Churches in Nicaragua). Nicole amplifies the voices of local people served by CEPAD and fosters relationships with CEPAD staff and beneficiaries. She enters homes, farmlands, and churches to listen to what God is doing. In turn, she shares with RCA supporters how their gifts are empowering rural communities to lift themselves out of poverty through pastoral training, leadership development, economic empowerment, food security, and environmental care. Nicole also serves as a cultural and language translator for visiting groups.

Chuck & Jean Van Engen – Latin America (RCA--Latin American Leadership Development Program)

Unprecedented growth among the Protestant churches in Latin America has created an urgent need for leaders who can mentor other leaders, disciple new believers, help transform society, and engage in cross-cultural mission. The Latin American Leadership Development Program (LALDP), a multinational and multi-denominational community of Latin American scholars, churches, and educational institutions, helps meet the need for advanced theological education in Spanish and Portuguese. This four-year doctoral program, which is directed and taught by Latin Americans, serves Latin American churches, missions, seminaries, and Bible schools. Chuck Van Engen, instrumental in starting the program, serves as president of Latin American Christian Ministries. Jean is accountant and chief financial officer for the LALDP.

NORTH AMERICA

Chris & Ren Briggs – Jamaica (RCA--Caribbean Christian Centre for the Deaf)

Chris and Ren Briggs live in the Jamaica Deaf Village where they work in partnership with the Caribbean Christian Centre for the Deaf (CCCD). With a mix of coordinating church and collegiate mission trips, engaging the Deaf community in the village, and managing and developing the textile business for CCCD, Chris's ministry is diverse, but it's all centered around engaging, equipping, and empowering the Deaf community to be all that God created them to be.

Barry & Terryl Bruce –USA (RCA--Way Out Ministries)

Barry and Terryl Bruce founded The Way Out Ministries in 1984 to reach the people of Hawaiian Gardens, a small urban area in Los Angeles County in California. Many of Hawaiian Gardens' families live below the national poverty level, and many young people turn to gangs for acceptance. Through The Way Out, Terryl and Barry coordinate weekly youth clubs, support groups, Bible studies, and a referral network of service agencies. Terryl is the principal of The Way Out Ministries Christian Academy, a private mission school for low-income junior and senior high school students. Barry is pastor of a church in the community that was planted by The Way Out Ministries in 2003. They have three children, Ryan, Rachel, and Michelle, all of whom are actively involved in ministry.

Rob & Kristi Dillingham –USA (Child Evangelism Fellowship)

The Dillingham's have recently departed from Arctic Barnabas Ministries and have begun to work with Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) in Alaska. As a family, they are training teens to work with children to help them learn and grow in the gospel. They also serve as coaches for a weekly Good News Club in a nearby town. During this initial phase, Rob has also developed and worked with a database for the overall workings of the ministry.

Grace Covenant Ministries – USA (RCA)

Mission work in Jackson County, Kentucky was started by the Reformed Church Women Domestic Mission Board in 1909 with the founding of the Anville Institute. When the boarding school closed in 1978, the campus became home to Jackson County Ministries, now called Grace Covenant Ministries (GCM). The ministry serves a region that is statistically considered one of the poorest in the United States, with the lowest life expectancy. GCM strives to make a difference by sharing the love of Jesus, one opportunity at a time. Jennifer Lucking –Canada (RCA--Restorations Second Stage Homes)

Jennifer is the Coordinator for Human Trafficking Outreach for the RCA. She will both come alongside people suffering in this area and also work with organizations and groups to help alleviate the exploitation of people. Jennifer started the “Restorations Second Stage Homes” to help women transition out of the sex-trade industry and now works for this organization that is supported by the RCA.

JeanJean & Kristie Mompremier – Haiti (United Christians International)

Their vision is to plant New Testament churches that will develop and unleash Haitian leaders who will then plant and develop additional churches, ministries and leaders. Most of their leadership training is in the context of church planting. Also crucial to UCI is the development of educational opportunities through primary and secondary schools and a university for the children, youth and adults in Haiti who struggle with enough affordable, quality education. Physical needs are also ministered to through the implementing of nutrition centers and by activities such as putting cement floors in homes.

GLOBAL

JJ Ten Clay – Global and Local (RCA--Refugee Ministry)

JJ is the Refugee Ministries Coordinator for RCA Global Mission. She educates and empowers RCA congregations to respond to the refugee crisis locally and globally. She also works with congregations to assist in their efforts to come alongside refugees in their communities. Her goal is to raise awareness and advocate with congregations, missionaries, and partners around the world to help alleviate the refugee crisis.

Words of Hope – Global Ministry

The mission of Words of Hope is to provide people both near and far with daily access to God’s Word.
